



Membership Options are Changing

We are simplifying our membership offerings.

Beginning April 15, two types of memberships will be available for new and renewing members: a Print membership, and a Digital membership.

Print membership will be available for mailing addresses in North America (USA-Canada-Mexico) for \$65/ year, and Digital membership will be available world-wide for \$55/year. (Regular membership is currently \$55/year.)

Digital membership is a new offering: ABANA's two premiere publications (The Anvil's Ring and The Hammer's Blow) will be sent digitally to a member's e-mail address on file; no print copies will be mailed.

ABANA is honoring existing memberships until their expiration date. And, moving forward, ABANA will offer annual memberships only, as the two-year membership option is no longer available.

The ABANA website and other ABANA collateral will reflect these new membership offerings which go into effect next month, April 2021.

TALES FROM BULVERDE.....

Just before the big snow ascended on south Texas, Shawn & I were taking a sightseeing drive around the Bulverde area. Our purpose was to observe how many new homes were being built on the beautiful ranches that surround this once quaint little town. The area has a tremendous amount of hills, rivers and creeks that offer splendid views especially if one takes the country back roads. Soon, we noticed yet another ranch with a freshly bull-dozed road with signs offering small acreage tracts of land for sale near the Cibolo creek, so we ventured in to have a look.

The Cibolo has, over thousands of years has cut deeply into the limestone bedrock leaving very high cliffs, insurmountable but for skilled mountain climbers, and caves of various densities. This area is very near the famous tourist attraction Natural Bridge Caverns and not too far from Cave Without a Name close to Boerne which was discovered by a rancher that while trying to rescue one of his goats from a cavass that later turned out to be a huge horizontal cave. Well, my wife & I spotted some smaller caves as we were driving around and stopped to get a better look at one which appeared to have 2 different openings. While we were stumbling along and taking photos, I spotted a rusty single leaf spring -- well I knew immediately, that spring being of high carbon steel would make great knives, so I threw it in the back of our truck.

As we drove around the use of 4-wheel drive was necessary and we soon spotted a windmill between two of the higher rocky hills, and I got out to take a photo. At that time another 4-wheel pickup lumbered up beside us and the guy wanted to know what we were doing up there. I said we were just sight-seeing and explained to him that we were having a great time exploring the Cibolo and all its wonders. I confessed to picking up the old leaf spring - he said, "yeah I saw ya" - and told him that I was a knife maker and would repurpose it into knives but would put it back if he wanted me to. He said nah, just keep it. We chatted awhile about the 300-acre ranch that has been in his family name since the 1800's and the log cabin house & barn that he was re-furbishing and he said we could drive around anywhere we wanted.

Well as we started back home, I told Shawn that I probably should make that guy a knife out of that spring since he didn't call the law on me for stealing it. So, I forged out a 10-inch hunter style complete with a hand sewn sheath and took it over to him. He graciously accepted the knife and said- that's nice - and put it back in the sheath. True, nothing fancy about the piece, just something to be used, not stored away in a gun cabinet. So, that was that.....or so I thought.

In about a week, he called me about replacing the handle on an old meat cleaver he had found in the old cabin. I said sure, and when I returned it to him with some bodark wooden slabs, his appreciation was kinda like - that's nice. OK, fine I thought to myself and as our brief conversation waned, he asked me "how much do I charge for the hunter style knife" - & I told him, hoping he might order another one like it. To my amazement, he said he wanted twenty more. So, over the next few weeks I was quite busy in my shop forging and making those knives. When I delivered the first ten, he was way back in hills of his ranch clearing more roads. I displayed the 10 knives on the tailgate of my truck, and he said - that's nice - and wrote me out a check when we got back to the house. The next ten knives were delivered to him and this time, he picked up each knife, tested it for sharpness, fit and finish, as well as sheath design and fit. He then wrote me out another check and handed it to me. I said - that's nice - and so completes this episode. Truly very thankful for his interest in my craftmanship of which he plans to give the knives out to individuals who buy acreage from him and hopefully that will generate a few more requests.
